3. SITE DESCRIPTION: Dalhart/Texline High Altitude Bombing Range occupied approximately 2,774 acres in Union County, New Mexico and is 32 miles northwest of Dalhart, Texas. Dalhart is approximately 100 miles north of Amarillo, Texas.

4. SITE HISTORY:

a. Prior the acquisition by the War Department, the land comprising Texline High Altitude Bombing Range was owned by the Department of Agriculture and was acquired by special permit for use as a high altitude precision bombing range. The only ordnance used on this FUDS were M38A1, 100 lb. Practice Bombs.

b. This land was turned back to the Department of Agriculture after the war and is currently part of the Kiowa National Grasslands. Mr. Emory Ensz grazes his cattle on this area.

6. CURRENT STATUS: The Archives Search Report (ASR) for Dalhart/Texline High Altitude Bombing Range was completed by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, St. Louis District, in December 1993.

7. STRATEGY: Entire Site: EE/CA

8. ISSUES AND CONCERNS:

a. The Huntsville Center Technical Advisory Group (TAG) reviewed this ASR on 19 May 1998 and concurs with the author's recommendation for a low level EE/CA. On this FUDS there is a pile of empty M38A1 practice bomb bodies in the former target area. Due to the remoteness and current use of this FUDS, removal actions should focus in the area around the bomb body pile and the target areas.

b. Based on the investigation of historical records reviewed, the results of the site survey and interviews, there is no evidence of Chemical Warfare Materials ever having been stored, used or disposed of at this site.

c. There are known Federally-and State- listed species occurring in the site area. An on-site inspection by appropriate State and Federal personnel may be necessary to verify the presence, absence or location of listed species, or natural communities.
