
Huntsville Center became the Mandatory Center of Expertise (MCX) for Electronic Security Systems in 1983.

The Center supports Headquarters, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers in criteria development for design, construction, procurement and evaluation of electronic security systems. In addition, we provide other Corps elements with technical assistance during design, construction, procurement and check-out phases of electronic security system projects.

Upon request by Government agencies, the Center provides technical, engineering, and contracting support in fielding electronic security systems. These services include site survey, design, procurement, installation, testing, monitoring, maintenance, and special studies. The Center further assists the Protective Design MCX with electronic security portions of their projects.

The Center has developed course materials and currently provides electronic security systems design courses for the Army and other U.S. agencies.

Huntsville Center offers its customers “cradle-to-grave” electronic security system technical services. If requested, the Center will survey, design, procure, install, test, monitor, and maintain electronic security systems worldwide.
