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U.S. Army Engineering and Support Center, Huntsville awards Environmental Remediation Contract valued at \$945 million

Huntsville, Ala. — The U.S. Army Engineering and Support Center, Huntsville, on Sept. 17-18 awarded a \$945 million shared-capacity contract to four companies that will provide remediation services support to several program areas.

The contract was awarded to AECOM of Long Beach, Calif., CH2M Hill Constructors Inc. of Atlanta, Ga., Parsons Infrastructure and Technology Group of Pasadena, Calif.; and URS Group Inc. of Omaha, Neb.

The multiple-award task order, indefinite delivery, indefinite quantity service contract is a shared-capacity contract with a base period of two years and three one-year option periods for a total of five years.

This requirement is for Worldwide Environmental Remediation Services (WERS) in support of the following programs: munitions clearance programs in support of contingency operations, the Military Munitions Response (MMR) Program, the Hazardous, Toxic, and Radiological Waste (HTRW) Program, the Chemical Warfare Material (CWM) Program, and other international operations. Military conventional and chemical munitions and hazardous wastes require a single response under both the Comprehensive Environmental Response Compensation and Liability Act (CERCLA) and the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA).

Huntsville Center continues to cooperate with local Corps districts, public officials and interested citizens and supports remediation operations when an imminent and substantial endangerment to public health or the environment exists.
