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Huntsville Center awards mine action contract to Tennessee firm

HUNTSVILLE, Ala. – The U.S. Army Engineering and Support Center, Huntsville awarded an \$18 million contract Dec. 17 to EOD Technology, Inc. (EODT) to continue mine clearance operations in Afghanistan.

The Lenoir, Tenn., headquartered company will perform its services under a multiple-award task order, indefinite delivery/ indefinite quantity service contract; a shared-capacity contract with a base period of one year and two six month option periods for a total of two years.

EODT work includes battle area clearance and mine clearance operations and supporting similar activities throughout Afghanistan and U.S. Central Command area of responsibility.

EODT was one of three companies originally selected for a 2009 Worldwide Environmental Remediation Services (WERS) contract supporting Military Munitions Response (MMR); Hazardous, Toxic, and Radiological Waste (HTRW) and Chemical Warfare Materiel (CWM) programs and other international operations in support of contingency operations and other international operations.

The U.S. Army Engineering and Support Center, Huntsville, supports very specialized missions that require unique technical expertise in programs that are generally national or very broad in scope. The Center supports tasks not normally accomplished by an HQUSACE element; tasks that require a centralized management structure, integrated facilities or systems that cross geographic division boundaries; and tasks that require commonality, standardization, multiple-site adaption or technology transfers.

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
