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Huntsville Center awards munitions contracts

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HUNTSVILLE, Ala. -- The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers awarded a \$250 million shared-capacity contract to three businesses to perform worldwide Military Munitions Response Services Sept. 17.

The contract is a Fixed-Price Response with Insurance agreement. This means that the contractor has to provide an insurance policy to cover any potential cost overruns on the project. The first task order under the new contract is for work at the former Lowry Bombing and Gunnery Range Bombing Target #5 in Colorado, and was awarded to CH2M Hill Constructors, Inc. in Atlanta, Ga. for \$4.6 million.

The two other businesses are Tetra Tech FW, Inc. in Morris Plains, N.J.; and Weston Solutions in West Chester, Penn.

The work will be performed at various Formerly Used Defense Sites (FUDS), active Department of Defense (DoD) Installations, DoD Base Realignment and Closure (BRAC) sites, property adjoining DoD installations, and for other U.S. government agencies as appropriate.

The award is for one two-year base and three one-year options. The three businesses selected under this solicitation may share up to \$250 million over five years based on competitive task orders issued from the Huntsville Center.

The Center solicited 39 companies, and seven proposals were submitted.

Huntsville Center is a Corps of Engineers Center of Expertise for Military Munitions Response action cleanups.

The Center functions to a large extent like a business in the private sector. Customers contract for the center's services and products. In return, Center employees commit to provide quality services and products in the most cost-efficient way possible.

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
