ARCHITECTURAL DESIGN OBJECTIVES, CONT'D.

SELECTION OF FURNITURE TO BE PROCURED SEPARATELY BY THE USING SERVICE SHOULD BE CARRIED OUT AS PART OF THE OVERALL BUILDING DESIGN AND INCLUDED AS PART OF A COMPREHENSIVE INTERIOR DESIGN TO BE PROVIDED WITH EACH YC DESIGN PACKAGE. FURNITURE SELECTION IS TO BE PUT IN A FORMAT THAT CAN BE READILY UNDERSTOOD BY INSTALLATION PERSONNEL WHO ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR PROCUREMENT AND THE PLACEMENT AND UTILIZATION OF THE FURNITURE AFTER DELIVERY. PLACEMENT PLANS, CATALOG ILLUSTRATIONS, MATERIAL AND COLOR SAMPLES, TOGETHER WITH SOURCE DATA AND COST ESTIMATES, SHOULD BE DEVELOPED AS APPROPRIATE TO ACCOMPLISH THIS OBJECTIVE.

FURNITURE SHOWN ON THE DEFINITIVE DRAWINGS IS TO ILLUSTRATE EXAMPLE ARRANGEMENTS ONLY, AND IS NOT INTENDED TO INDICATE MANDATORY TYPES, QUANTITIES OR ARRANGEMENTS. FINAL SELECTION MUST BE BASED ON THE NEEDS ESTABLISHED DURING THE PLANNING STAGE AND THE ESTIMATES PROVIDED AS PART OF THE 1391 SUPPORT DATA. PRELIMINARY SCHEDULES SHOULD BE REVIEWED CAREFULLY, COORDINATED AGAIN WITH THE LOCAL USING SERVICE, AND SELECTIONS MADE FROM THE LATEST MANDATORY SOURCE CATALOGS. SPECIFIC FURNITURE AND EQUIPMENT SHOULD BE VERIFIED WITH THE USER. FIXED EQUIPMENT IS NORMALLY PROVIDED BY CONSTRUCTION FUNDS. FURNISHINGS AND PORTABLE EQUIPMENT ARE NORMALLY SUPPLIED BY THE USING SERVICE. FOR VARIOUS ITEMS, THE DECISION ON WHICH FUNDING SOURCE APPLIES SHOULD BE BASED ON CONSIDERATION OF OVERALL CONSTRUCTION COST AND LIKELY APPROVABLE TOTAL BUDGET AVAILABILITY OF OTHER FUNDS FROM MILITARY AND NONMILITARY SOURCES, AND WHICH SOURCE CAN BEST PROVIDE THE ITEMS IN QUESTION.

FURNITURE SELECTION SHOULD BE BASED ON THE FOLLOWING GENERAL CRITERIA:

(1) APPEARANCE. FURNITURE IS AN INTEGRAL PART OF THE OVERALL BUILDING DESIGN AND SHOULD BE CLOSELY COORDINATED WITH THE SELECTION OF COLORS AND FINISH MATERIALS FOR CONSISTENCY IN APPEARANCE AND QUALITY. A CLEAR RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE FURNITURE FINISH SCHEME AND THE BUILDING FINISH MATERIALS SHOULD BE EVIDENT. SIZE AND PROPORTION OF FURNITURE DESIGN MUST CONSIDER THE SCALE OF THE ROOM IN WHICH IT IS TO BE PLACED.

(2) DURABILITY, COMFORT AND SAFETY. CAREFUL ATTENTION MUST BE GIVEN TO ALL INTERIOR FURNISHINGS TO ENSURE THAT THE TYPE OF FURNITURE CHOSEN CONFORMS TO STANDARDS OF DURABILITY, COMFORT AND SAFETY APPROPRIATE FOR THE USE THEY WILL RECEIVE. BEING GENERALLY MOBILE, FURNITURE PARTS THAT RECEIVE THE MOST WEAR SHOULD BE REPLACEABLE AND FINISHES SHOULD SUSTAIN REGULAR CLEANING. COLORS, TEXTURES, PROPORTIONS, AND SHAPES ARE IMPORTANT COMFORT FACTORS THAT SHOULD BE CONSIDERED. FURNITURE AND EQUIPMENT MUST WITHSTAND LOADING CONDITIONS WITHOUT DAMAGE. EDGES AND SURFACES SHOULD BE SMOOTH AND ROUNDED. MATERIALS MUST BE FLAME RETARDANT.

(3) MOBILITY AND INTERCHANGEABILITY. MOST INTERIOR FURNISHINGS SHOULD NOT BE OF A SCALE WHICH WOULD REQUIRE MORE THAN TWO PERSONS TO RELOCATE THEM, OR BE SO COMPLICATED AS TO REQUIRE AN UNDUABLE AMOUNT OF TIME TO ASSEMBLE OR DISASSEMBLE. WHERE POSSIBLE, CARE SHOULD BE TAKEN TO CHOOSE MULTIPURPOSE FURNISHINGS AESTHETICALLY SUITABLE FOR A VARIETY OF NEEDS AND ACTIVITIES. STACKABLE AND FOLDABLE FURNITURE SHOULD BE CONSIDERED FOR REDUCING BULKINESS IN STORAGE AND TRANSPORT WHERE SUCH REQUIREMENTS EXIST.

SPECIFIC SPACES WITH THEIR UNIQUE REQUIREMENTS ARE AS FOLLOWS:

GAME ROOM: PRIMARILY USED FOR ACTIVE, MODERATELY NOISY SPORTS LIKE TABLE TENNIS, BILLIARDS, FOOTBALL, AND ELECTRONIC GAME MACHINES. INCLUDES SPACE FOR OBSERVING, WAITING TURNS AND LOUNGING. AS A SECONDARY USE, IT MAY BE CONVERTED TO USE FOR LARGE GROUP ACTIVITIES. IN SMALLER FACILITIES, IT MAY BE USED AS A SECOND LOUNGE. IT IS IMPORTANT THAT THIS SPACE BE ACOUSTICALLY ISOLATED FROM THE SMALL MULTIPURPOSE ROOM, WITH CONSTRUCTION HAVING A MINIMUM STC RATING OF 50. PROVIDE HALF GLASS WALLS (COMPLYING WITH FIRE PROTECTION REQUIREMENTS) TO ENSURE VIEWS FROM THE SNACK AREA, CORRIDOR, LOUNGE AND ISSUE COUNTER AS SHOWN ON THE DRAWINGS. DO NOT USE FULL HEIGHT GLASS AT INTERIOR OR EXTERIOR GAME ROOM WALLS. CARPET OR AN EASILY CLEANABLE, RESILIENT FLOORING MAY BE USED FOR FLOOR SURFACES. A MINIMUM 12'-0" CEILING HEIGHT IS REQUIRED TO AVOID DAMAGE BY POOL CUES. TYPICAL FURNISHINGS AND PORTABLE EQUIPMENT MAY INCLUDE TABLE TENNIS TABLES, POOL TABLES, CUE RACKS, FOOTBALL TABLES, PINBALL AND ELECTRONIC VIDEO GAMES, CARD TABLES, WALL CLOCK, AND JUKEBOX. DURABLE BUILT-IN SEATING SHOULD BE CONSIDERED. CONSIDER PROVIDING A DARK GLASS PARTITION BETWEEN THE VIDEO GAMES AND THE REMAINDER OF THE AREA FOR REDUCTION OF LIGHT TO FACILITATE VIEWING OF VIDEO SCREENS. CONSTRUCT OPTIONAL GLASS PARTITION OF A MINIMUM 1/4" THICK, TINTED, MAR-RESISTANT POLYCARBONATE GLAZING EQUAL TO LEXAN MR5 SHEET.

LOUNGES: THE LARGE LOUNGE WILL BE USED FOR SOCIALIZING WITH SMALL SUBSPACES FOR SEVERAL SIMULTANEOUS CONVERSATION GROUPS OR SMALL MEETINGS. TABLES FOR BOARD/CARD GAMES OR SNACKING, LISTENING, OR FOR A LARGE GROUP WATCHING SPECIAL EVENTS ON TELEVISION.
