The International Operations Division, within the Ordnance and Explosives Directorate, Huntsville Center, provides international support for ordnance, demining, environmental and other required support actions.

### Mission

The IO Division executes support missions for the Army and the Soldier in the field. Teams are deployed to establish an in-country presence and provide contract project oversight through other Corps entities and/or COR (Contracting Officer Representative) presence.

### Projects

- **Coalition Munitions Disposal, Iraq** — Operating since 2008 as a centralized collection point for the disposal of U.S. unserviceable ammunition and items recovered by field units. An operating budget of \$10 million has been approved for FY10.
- **MLRS AP Rocket Motor Disposal, Penn.** — Developing a thermal-based, closed-disposal process for ammonium perchlorate rocket motors at Letterkenny Munitions Center. Once in place, up to 8,000 Multiple Launch Rocket System (MLRS) motors, in addition to 2,000 smaller rocket motors of different weapon systems, would be demilitarized per year. An operating budget of \$6.1 million has been funded for FY10.
- **Bagram Airfield Demining and Clearance, Afghanistan** — Providing battle area and mine clearance support at Bagram Air Field and adjacent areas, including the Eastern Expansion Area and the Soviet Motor Pool site, for base expansion efforts. An operating budget of \$34 million has been approved for FY10.
- **USFOR-Afghanistan** — Mobile team support for MILCON demining in Afghanistan Theater of Operations. There are approximately 30 million square meters identified for clearance. An operating budget of \$66 million has been funded for FY10.
- **Operation Task Force Power, Afghanistan** — Performing low voltage electrical inspections of all U.S. Forces occupied facilities in Afghanistan, including fire safety inspections and training. An operating budget of more than \$57 million has been approved for FY10.
- **Story Live Fire Training Complex, Republic of South Korea** — Ongoing MEC (munitions and explosives of concern) survey and delineation/removal, with an emphasis on landmines, for future military construction activities and to allow troop ground movement at Story Training Area in South Korea. A budget of \$3 million has been approved for FY10.
