Huntsville Center teams up with Operation Green Team, mayor to attend

HUNTSVILLE, Ala. – The U.S. Army Engineering and Support Center, Huntsville, would like to invite you to its Earth Day 2007 cleanup at Pinhook Creek April 20 from 1 - 4 p.m.

Who: Huntsville Center employees along with their friends and families will be participating. Operation Green Team will also be on hand with Mayor Loretta Spencer.

What: Huntsville Center has teamed up with Operation Green Team to organize a cleanup project to clear the garbage that has built up at the mouth of Pinhook Creek. Pinhook Creek is an invaluable resource to the Huntsville area and is home to one of the nation's few Tupelo wetlands and a variety of wildlife.

Where: Pinhook Creek is off of Byrd Spring Road. Take South Memorial Parkway and make a right on Byrd Spring Road. Byrd Spring Road dead ends into the preserve.

When: Friday April 20, 1 - 4 p.m.

Why: It is extremely important to preserve nature — especially wetlands. One of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers' primary missions is environmental stewardship, so it only makes sense for Huntsville Center to do its part to help keep Huntsville clean and beautiful.
