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## **Huntsville Center awards more munitions contracts**

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HUNTSVILLE, Ala. -- The Engineering and Support Center, Huntsville awarded contracts to three businesses to perform worldwide Munitions Response Services and Other Munitions Related Services on April 8.

The three businesses are Explosive Ordnance Technologies Inc. in Rumson, N.J., Shaw Environmental & Infrastructure, Inc. in Baton Rouge, La., and TetraTech FW Inc. in Huntsville, Ala.

The Center previously awarded Munitions Response Services and Other Munitions Related Services contracts to four businesses in February. The four businesses are Parsons Infrastructure and Technology Group, Inc. in Pasadena, Calif., USA Environmental, Inc. in Tampa, Fla., Zapata Engineering P.A. in Charlotte, N.C., and Environmental Chemical Corporation in Burlingame, Calif.

The contracts will eventually replace Huntsville Center's existing \$200 million Ordnance and Explosives services contracts.

The contracts are for one base year with four option years. The seven businesses will share up to \$525 million for the first year based on task orders they receive from the Huntsville Center.

Parsons, Shaw and TetraTech are large businesses. EOTI, USA Environmental, Zapata and ECC are small businesses.

The Center solicited 63 companies, and 15 proposals were submitted.

Munitions Response Services and Other Munitions Related Services include projects at Formerly Used Defense Sites, active Department of Defense Installations, DoD Base Realignment and Closure sites, property adjoining DoD installations and projects for other U.S. government agencies or foreign governments.

"About 75 percent of the work awarded under the contracts is expected to be performed as part of the U.S. Army's Captured Enemy Ammunition mission in Iraq and possibly in other areas outside the United States," said Dan Coberly, the Huntsville Center spokesman.

Huntsville Center is the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers' Military Munitions Response Program Center of Expertise.

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The Center functions to a large extent like a business in the private sector. Customers contract for the center's services and products. In return, Center employees commit to provide quality services and products in the most cost-efficient way possible.
